We are looking for volunteer Catering Assistants to help with the running of The Cellar Trust Café. Our café is run by a dedicated team of volunteers and clients in conjunction with the Catering Manager and Assistant Catering Manager. The café aims to help our clients gain practical and social skills to assist them in gaining employment and to develop healthy routines in a positive environment.

We want volunteers who can work as part of our friendly catering team by performing simple catering tasks to help with the day to day running of The Cellar Trust Café. An important part of this volunteer role is to also help foster a supportive, welcoming atmosphere in the café and assist individual clients on placement with us. Some catering experience is preferred but not required, and full training will be given.

Typical tasks will include:

- Assisting with catering tasks such as preparing ingredients, cooking, cleaning and preparing work surfaces and disposing of waste
- Customer service while working on the till, taking orders, serving food and assisting with any customer queries
- Supporting the Catering Manager and Assistant Catering Manager with general maintenance and cleaning of the café and catering facilities
- Working within all food hygiene regulations and ensuring we meet the highest standard of food hygiene
- Supervision of clients carrying out catering activities

- People with experience or interest in catering
- People who enjoy working with others in a social environment
- People who are passionate about supporting others
- Awareness of and empathy for mental health problems and how they can impact on the people's lives
